You are invited to write down your thoughts. Feel free to raise any topic. The questions are only a guide and springboard.

Question 1. Lutheran worship is to be according to God's word with the primary emphasis on the Triune God's presence amongst us to serve us. The style however can vary. Currently we alternate between a more contemporary and more traditional type of service. Are you happy with this? Can you suggest other service formats? What can we do to ensure we do our best with worship?

Question 2. We currently worship at 10.00am on Sunday mornings. Is this the best time slot available?

Question 3. Divine service, which does include education and fellowship, is to be at the heart of all that we do as Lutheran Christians. However, in an increasingly complex world in depth Christian education is needed to understand and respond to many pressing issues and genuine relationships and community is sought by many to supplement what takes place in the worship service. Small groups, special studies, prayer breakfasts are just a few of the ways we have provided in this area. Please let us know what you have found helpful in this area along with suggested ways to proceed in the future.

Question 4. We are thankful for our wonderful worship center. Can you suggest ways of making it even more inviting or utilizing it better? Do you have a suggestion as to what it should be named?


Question 5. Are there community needs that you can list that you would like to see us addressing and can you suggest how we might go about this.

St Peters Lutheran Church Hobart Survey to be submitted by May 1st, 2016

St Peters is in a time of change:

- * New building
- * New Pastor after a period of vacancy
- * Growing college

At the 2016 AGM, the following motion was passed.

That SPLC establishes a Task Force to review and make recommendations regarding the following:

1. The style and timing of worship services. This would include examination of traditional and modern styles with respect to suitability and inclusivity such that every effort is made to cater for all needs.
2. Existing small groups and establishment of new small groups, with a particular emphasis on setting up a Youth Group. The aim is to determine and implement appropriate small groups so as to include as many existing and new members as is feasible. Suitable training and coordination of leaders to be examined.
3. Establishment of links to external groups to provide assistance for persons in need where we cannot provide suitable support. This could include alcohol and drug dependency, family issues, pregnancy support, homelessness, etc.

The motion also specifically asked that we devote ourselves to prayer and/or fasting to seek God's direction for the review.

HARVEST THANKSGIVING: The service next Sunday has been set as a harvest thanksgiving. If you are able to donate any goods that can be used as a display could you please let Kim know or bring them to the Church no later than Saturday morning.

COULD YOU JOIN OUR POWERPOINT PRESENTATION TEAM?
